| 1 – 8 | 1^{st} & 2^{nd} couple dance the Bourrell 1^{st} man & 2^{nd} woman: set advancing, turn two hands (using pas de basque step) 1/2way pulling back right shoulder and finish back to back in the centre of the set with the 2^{nd} woman facing up and the 1^{st} man facing down. At the same time, 1^{st} woman & 2^{nd} man dance contra-clockwise round the set to finish facing their partner in a line up and down the dance. All set. All turn partner 3/4 with the right hand, to finish with 1^{st} couple facing out in second place & 2^{nd} couple facing in and down in top place. |

| 9 – 12 | Half a Reel of three on the sidelines, with 1^{st} woman passing 3^{rd} woman by the right shoulder to begin and 1^{st} man passing 2^{nd} man by the right shoulder. Order is now 3,1,2 & 1^{st} couple face out in 2^{nd} place on their own sides, flowing into |
| 13 – 16 | 1^{st} woman & 3^{rd} woman turn once with the left hand, while 1st man & 2^{nd} man turn once with the left hand. 1^{St} couple faces out in 2^{nd} place on their own side of the set. |
| 17 – 20 | Half a Reel of three on the sidelines, with 1^{st} woman passing 2^{nd} woman by the right shoulder and 1st man passing 3^{rd} man by the right shoulder. Order is now 2,1,3 & 1^{st} couple face out on own side of set, flowing into |
| 21 – 24 | 1^{st} woman & 2^{nd} woman turn once with the left hand, while 1st man & 3rd man turn once with the left hand. All three couples finish facing in. |
| 25 – 32 | 2 nd ,1st & 3 rd couples dance six hands round and back. |

The Peat Road: is a narrow, single track road that twists & turns with few passing places & is the "short cut" between Finsbay & Leverburgh in South Harris, one of the islands of the Outer Hebrides in Scotland. The Peat Road winds along the shores of Loch Langabhat & over the moor, past the peat beds, where the crofters cut & stack the peat. Once dried, it is transported to their croft houses & used as fuel.
