## The $50^{th}$ Tartan Ball Reel $\sim$ also known as The Peat Road

## THE PEAT ROAD

8X32 Reel (3cpls in a 4 couple set)

1 – 8	1 <sup>st</sup> & 2 <sup>nd</sup> couple dance the Bourrell 1 <sup>st</sup> man & 2 <sup>nd</sup> woman: set advancing, turn two hands (using pas de basque step) 1/2way pulling back right shoulder and finish back to back in the centre of the set with the 2 <sup>nd</sup> woman facing up and the 1 <sup>st</sup> man facing down. At the same time, 1 <sup>st</sup> woman & 2 <sup>nd</sup> man dance contra-clockwise round the set to finish facing their partner in a line up and down the dance. All set. All turn partner 3/4 with the right hand, to finish with 1 <sup>st</sup> couple facing out in second place & 2 <sup>nd</sup> couple facing in and down in top place.
9 – 12	Half a Reel of three on the sidelines, with 1 <sup>st</sup> woman passing 3 <sup>rd</sup> woman by the right shoulder to begin and 1 <sup>st</sup> man passing 2 <sup>nd</sup> man by the right shoulder. Order is now 3,1,2 & 1 <sup>st</sup> couple face out in 2 <sup>nd</sup> place on their own sides, flowing into
13 – 16	1 <sup>st</sup> woman & 3 <sup>rd</sup> woman turn once with the left hand, while 1st man & 2 <sup>nd</sup> man turn once with the left hand. 1 <sup>St</sup> couple faces out in 2 <sup>nd</sup> place on their own side of the set.
17 – 20	Half a Reel of three on the sidelines, with 1 <sup>st</sup> woman passing 2 <sup>nd</sup> woman by the right shoulder and 1st man passing 3 <sup>rd</sup> man by the right shoulder. Order is now 2,1,3 & 1 <sup>st</sup> couple face out on own side of set, flowing into
21 – 24	1 <sup>st</sup> woman & 2 <sup>nd</sup> woman turn once with the left hand, while 1st man &3rd man turn once with the left hand. All three couples finish facing in.
25 – 32	2 <sup>nd</sup> ,1st & 3 <sup>rd</sup> couples dance six hands round and back.

The Peat Road: is a narrow, single track road that twists & turns with few passing places & is the "short cut" between Finsbay & Leverburgh in South Harris, one of the islands of the Outer Hebrides in Scotland. The Peat Road winds along the shores of Loch Langabhat & over the moor, past the peat beds, where the crofters cut & stack the peat. Once dried, it is transported to their croft houses & used as fuel.
